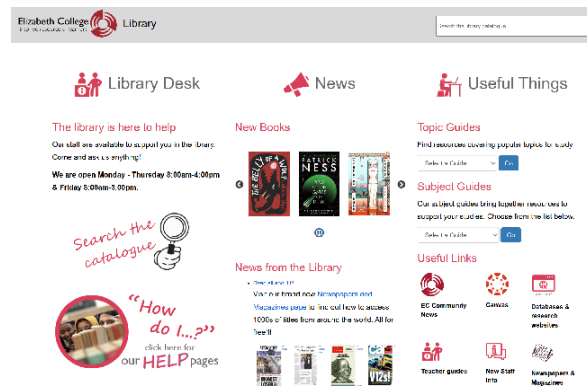
We live in a time of information overload, and this can be difficult for college students.
