COURSES

SHB20121 Certificate II in Retail Cosmetics SoA

2 lines 9 units 33 TCE points

Students will have an opportunity to speak with industry experts, learn and apply skills in a practical setting using our onsite salon, and participate in demonstrations and workshops.

CHC22015 Certificate II in Community Services (Children Focus)

2 lines 9 units 33 TCE points

This qualification provides deep insight into the childcare industry. Students are responsible for organising and facilitating a weekly onsite playgroup and require a **WWVP card** to participate in this course. Students will also be provided with an opportunity to complete their First Aid Certificate via St John's Ambulance.

DEF10117 Certificate I in Defence Skills

1 line 9 units 19 TCE points

Students will have the opportunity to participate in simulated defence training and ceremonial practices through camps and off-site activities. Students will interact with members of the Australian Defence Force and develop fundamental skills that will assist in any career pathway.

SIS20321 Certificate II in Sport Coaching (EOI)

1 line 7 units 15 TCE points minimum

This qualification is valuable for students in pursuit of working in organised sport or other related sport, recreation and fitness occupations.

SIS20122 Certificate II in Sport and Recreation SoA

1 line 7 units 17 TCE points

As part of this qualification, students will assist with the organisation and running of community sporting events, including feeder-school carnivals. Students will have the opportunity to gain their First Aid qualification through St John's Ambulance and will participate in a work placement relating to their field of choice.

SIT20122 Certificate II in Tourism SoA (Adventure Tourism Focus) (EOI)

1 line 6 units 15 TCE points minimum

This qualification is valuable for students wanting to pursue a career in one of Tasmania's biggest industries. It is also suitable for students wanting to pursue a career in the sport, recreation and fitness industry as well as students with a keen interest in outdoor activities.

AUR20712 Certificate II in Automotive Vocational Preparation

1 line over 2 yrs 6 units per year 33 TCE points total (16/17)

This qualification provides an opportunity to build mechanical and electrical knowledge and skill in an industry equivalent workshop, working on real vehicles.

CPC20120 Certificate II in Construction

2 lines 15 units 46 TCE points

This qualification is suited to Year 11 students who are considering a future in the construction industry. Students have the opportunity to work on real-world projects, in an industry standard working environment. Students will receive their **white card** as part of this qualification and will have an opportunity to participate in a work placement.

CPC20220 Certificate II in Construction Pathways

2 lines 6 units 29 TCE points

This qualification builds skills and knowledge in the primary trades of the construction industry, including bricklaying and plastering. Students will have an opportunity to participate in a work placement and will work on real-world enterprise projects, in an industry standard working environment.

MEM20422 Certificate II in Engineering Pathways (EOI)

2 lines 12 units 42 TCE points

This qualification is suited to students who are considering a future in the engineering or manufacturing industry.

SIT20421 Certificate II in Cookery

2 lines 13 units 36 TCE points

This qualification builds skills and knowledge in kitchen operations. Students will participate in the running of our onsite school café, Betty's, and will partake in the catering for small- and large-scale functions. Students work in an industry standard kitchen and will be provided with an opportunity to complete their First Aid Certificate via St John's Ambulance.

SIT20322 Certificate II in Hospitality

2 lines 12 units 34 TCE points

Students will gain nationally recognised skills such as Responsible Service of Alcohol, First Aid and Barista training. Students will also have an opportunity to practice their hospitality skills operating our onsite school café, Betty's.

UEE22020 Certificate II in Electrotechnology (Career Start) SoA

1 line 6 units 17 TCE points

This qualification is a great pathway to a career as an electrician, fridge mechanic or other electrical related trade. Students will gain valuable connections with industry through this course. It provides a great foundation for further education and training.

UEE22120 Certificate II in Sustainable Energy (Career Start) SoA (EOI)

1 line 6 units 15 TCE points

This qualification is valuable for students in pursuit of work or an apprenticeship in the sustainable energy space. It can also provide a diversified foundation for university studies in the area.
